
# **EAPFP President visits Firex International**

Visitors were offered detailed advice on which passive fire protection products will be required to carry a CE mark when

The EAPFP campaigns to raise the standard of fire safety in buildings and has representation on the European Union Technical Committees involved in developing product standards across Europe . The EAPFP is leading a campaign to increase the number of passive fire protection products that are subject to mandatory CE marking on the European market.

Under the CPR, any product for which a harmonised European product standard (hEN) exists will be required to carry a CE Mark from 1 July 2013. The EAPFP has been calling for voluntary European Technical Approval Guidelines (ETAGs) for a range of passive fire protection products to be converted to hENs. According to the EAPFP, such a move will improve the quality of products available on the European market.
